



**King of Hearts**

King of Hearts is one of the greatest bona fide cult-films of all time. Philippe de Broca's 1966 French comedy-drama starring Alan Bates is set in a small town in France near the end of World War I. The German Army has booby trapped the whole town to explode. As the locals flee, a gaggle of cheerful lunatics escape the asylum and take over the town. This enchanting film was so popular it ran continuously for five years at the Central Square Cinemas in Cambridge, Massachusetts, as well as other repertory movie theaters. When the Magic Lantern opened in 1974, King of Hearts had a regular spot on its monthly schedules through 1978.





**Sagrada**

The Sagrada Família in Barcelona is a unique and fascinating building project by a brilliant, formerly controversial genius, Antoni Gaudi, with an army of workers, a history with many highs and lows and a myriad of questions raised. The biography of the edifice, which has been under construction since 1882 and is about half completed today, is the starting point for Stefan Haupt's film SAGRADA, el misteri de la creacio.
