Program Overview:

An in-school program designed for elementary students to explore creativity through the theatrical arts, work as a collective, and experience being effective, empowered leaders and followers. Trained theatre educators lead students through physical exercises that encourage individual expression and appreciation of others' perspectives.

Outcomes

- For 19 years the program has served as Blaine County School District's elementary THEATRE CURRICULUM
- Exercises meet National Core Arts Standards for theatre
- Students develop SELF-EXPRESSION skills and IMPROVISATIONAL SKILLS
- Program lays the FOUNDATION for student understanding of the theatrical and physical arts as a means for creating INDEPENDENCE within themselves—even from facts
- Strengthens team building and RESPECT among students

By the Numbers

- Offered FREE annually to every elementary grade students, grades 1–5, in 4 district schools
- Reaching approximately 1,800 students per season

National Research Supports

- When students have the ability to PHYSICALLY ENGAGE in storytelling, their overall UNDERSTANDING of narrative improves
- Drama instruction increases READING READINESS and WORD FLUENCY in early grades
- Literacy skills in second and third grade students are fostered through movement and IMPROVISATION EXERCISES
