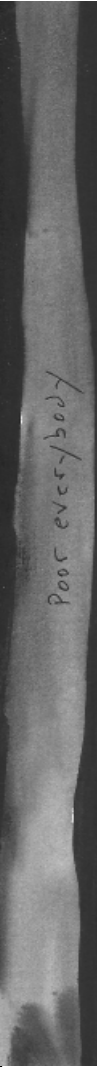

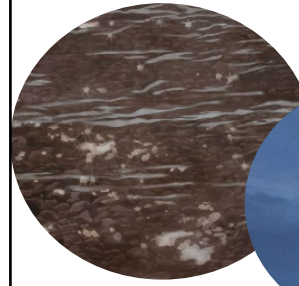
How does this artist use writing in his art?
