WHO CAN APPLY AND WHAT AMOUNT CAN I BE AWARDED?

WENDY AND ALLEN PESKY SCHOLARSHIP:

Blaine County educators pursuing professional development linking to the arts and humanities. Recipients may receive up to \$1200.

GAY V. WEAKE SCHOLARSHIP: Seniors in high school or full-time college students pursuing arts and humanities majors. Renewal award where recipients receive \$2000 each year of undergraduate study.

EZRA POUND SCHOLARSHIP: Public, private and home-schooled students in Blaine County currently enrolled in 11th grade pursuing study outside of their regular school hours in the visual arts. Recipient will receive \$5000.

JACK THORNTON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: Public, private and home-schooled students in Blaine County currently enrolled in 11th or 12th grade pursuing study outside of their regular school hours in the performing arts. Recipient will receive \$3000.

HIGH SCHOOL ARTS AND HUMANITIES SCHOLARSHIP: Public, private and home-schooled students in Blaine County currently enrolled in grades 9th-12th pursuing study outside of their regular school hours in the arts and humanities. Recipients can receive up to \$2500.
